was designed to support emerging European ensembles) was designed to support emerging European ensembles in the field of early music, help them to find their way into the highly contrasted and unevenly developed world of early music and face the realities of the international market.

For this purpose, 8 European partners came together with the precious support of Creative Europe for the October 2014 - September 2018 period: the Ambronay Cultural Encounter Center, the National Music University of Bucharest, the Internationale Händel Festspiele Göttingen, Ars Ramovs Ljubljana, the Collegio Ghislieri in Pavia, the Riga Early Music Center, Ozango Productions in Strasbourg and the National Center for Early Music in York, supported by many others across Europe.

Together, they set up a scheme to identify, select, train, promote and contribute to disseminating the best European ensembles of early music, the scheme being centered on artistic residencies. These residencies, organized by each of the partners, make it possible to give the selected groups a specific training in order to develop their international mobility, their individual and collective careers and to promote their professional insertion on the market.

- to build a strong entrepreneurial and artistic education curriculum for the Ensembles,
- to encourage professional integration and promotion of the best Ensembles on the European market,
- to disseminate and make Early Music better known internationally,
- to contribute to the discovery and circulation of a European cultural heritage covering more than ten centuries of music known, unacknowledged or unknown.
- and to promote a young, dynamic and citizen-friendly image of Europe.

But eeemerging is above all a unique human experience, full of adventures, amazing places, exciting trips and unlikely get-togethers; a rich intercultural dialogue between audiences, artists, organizers and other professionals in the cultural sector.
